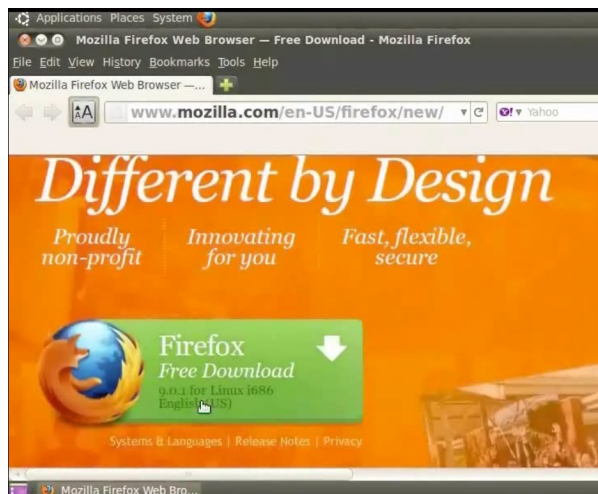
Introduction

Mozilla Firefox or simply Firefox is a free, open-source web browser. It is the default web browser for Ubuntu Linux, serving as a window to the internet. It allows you to view the Internet web pages and navigate through them. Firefox has been developed by volunteer programmers at the Mozilla Foundation, a non-profit organization. Download and Installation

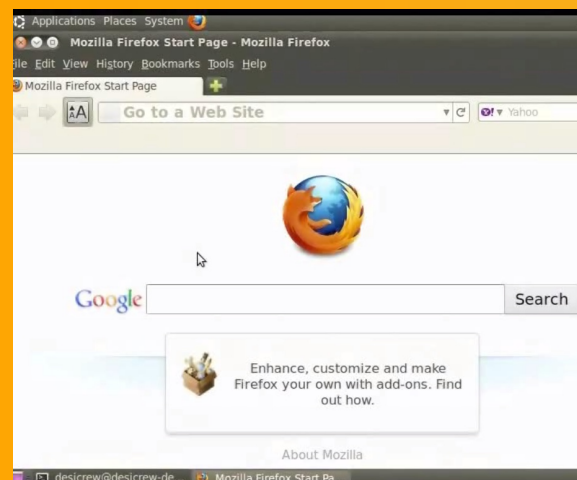

Features

- **Autocomplete:** Firefox remembers the pages that you have visited and shows page suggestions in the address bar drop-down
- **Tabbed browsing:** eliminates the need to display multiple browser windows.
- **Pop up blocker:** prevents unwanted popup windows from interfering with and cluttering your browsing experience.
- **Themes:** help to improve the look and feel of the browser. It customizes the Firefox browser to your unique taste.
- **Bookmark:** give you quick access to pages that you visit frequently or wish to read in detail at a later time.
- **Extensions:** allow you to add new features to the Firefox browser, thereby enhancing existing features. They help customize the Firefox browser to suit your preferences.
